The replay also features performances by the New Orleans Pelicans Entertainment team.

LSU's Pete Maravich Assembly Center was host of the game earlier this year, which not only gave the victorious House bragging rights for the year, but also raised money for the refurbishment of outdoor basketball courts in two Legislative districts.

The House nabbed a 38-30 win with the help of New Orleans Rep. Matthew Willard, the game's MVP. Port Allen Sen. Rick Ward was the game's high scorer.

As is tradition, after the game, the names of two legislators were drawn from a bowl to determine whose districts would receive funding for court facelifts.
