**Local Governmental Units - Elections (April 4, 2020)**

**3. L19-291 - Calcasieu Parish Police Jury, Sales Tax District No. 4-A**

1½% sales tax, 10 years, beginning January 1, 2021, (1) improving and maintaining parish roads and arterial transportation routes and intersections, (2) enhancing drainage, solid waste collection and disposal, (3) installation or extensions to public utilities, (4) funding for rural transportation systems and (5) funding into bonds for capital improvements.

**4. L19-293 - East Baton Rouge Parish Law Enforcement District**

3.73 mills tax, 10 years, 2021-2030, operational purposes.

**5. L19-308 - Evangeline Parish, City of Ville Platte**

4.0 mills tax, 10 years, 2024-2033, (1) maintenance and operation of the police and fire department, including acquisition of necessary equipment and (2) pay salaries, benefits and related expenses.

**6. L19-304 - Evangeline Parish, Prairie Mamou Gravity Drainage District No. 8**

3.5 mills tax, 10 years, 2022-2031, acquiring, constructing, improving, maintaining or operating drainage works.

**7. L19-295 - Lafourche Parish, Town of Lockport**

10.0 mills tax, 10 years, 2020-2029, police protection.

**8. L19-302 - St. Landry Parish, Town of Grand Coteau**

15.0 mills tax, 10 years, 2020-2029, acquiring, construction, improving, maintaining and operating fire protection and equipment.

**9. L19-305 - Tangipahoa Parish, Village of Tickfaw**

Rededicating half of the 10.0 mills tax hereafter-received, currently authorized to be levied in perpetuity, for supporting the general fund and general operations.

**10. L19-313 - Washington Parish, City of Bogalusa**

¼% sales tax, rededicate proceeds as follows: (1) all unexpended net revenues previously collected to support the City's industrial park, as well as all future net revenues shall be rededicated and used to pay retirement benefits and costs related to pensions, including but not limited to payments owed to the City of Bogalusa Employees Retirement System (COBERS) for employer contributions for active employees of the City and payments toward the unfunded accrued liability as determined by the actuary for COBERS, provided that (2) any future net revenues exceeding the City's obligations to COBERS for a fiscal year as described in the purpose above may be budgeted and used to operation and maintenance of the City's industrial park.

**11. L19-314 - West Feliciana Parish School Board**

(1) Parishwide - 1/2% sales tax, 10 years, beginning July 1, 2020, (a) acquire, improve, maintain, operate and support public elementary and secondary schools, (b) any other School Board purposes and (c) continuing the laptop program to the high school students and including a state mandated foreign language program for elementary and middle school students; (2) Consolidated School District No. 1 - 3.75 mills tax, 10 years, 2022-2031, paying salaries and benefits to all employees covered by the local instructional and non-instructional salary schedules.

Not exceeding \$40,000,000 Revenue Anticipation Notes, not exceeding 6%, mature no later than June 30, 2020, current expenses.

**Local Political Subdivisions - Bonds - Final Approval**

**13. L19-307 - Avoyelles Parish, Avoyelles Water Commission**

Not exceeding \$11,000,000 Water Revenue Refunding Bonds, in one or more series, not exceeding 5%, not exceeding 25 years, (1) refunding Water Revenues Notes, Series 2005A and 2005B and (2) funding a reserve fund or paying the cost of a reserve policy.

**14. L19-294 - Beauregard Parish, Hospital Service District No. 2**

Not exceeding \$3,732,000 Excess Revenue Bonds, not exceeding 3.95%, mature no later than April 1, 2029, acquiring, constructing and installing equipment, fixtures, improvements and replacements to the hospital facilities.

**15. L19-298 - Caddo Parish Commission**

Not exceeding \$30,000,000 Limited Tax Revenue Bonds, in one or more series, not exceeding 6%, not exceeding 20 years, capital projects, including but not limited to acquiring, constructing, improving, equipping and furnishing public buildings and facilities.

**16. L19-310 - Catahoula Parish, Town of Jonesville**

Not exceeding \$1,000,000 Taxable Revenue Refunding Bonds, not exceeding 3.5%, mature no later than December 1, 2027, refunding Taxable Utilities Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2013.

**17. L19-284 - East Baton Rouge Parish, Metropolitan Council of the Parish of East Baton Rouge and City of Baton Rouge**

Not exceeding \$10,000,000 Public Improvement Sales Tax Revenue Bonds, not exceeding 5%, not exceeding 15 years, drainage improvements.

**18. L19-303 - East Baton Rouge Parish, Zachary Community School Board, Zachary Community School District No. 1**

Not exceeding \$17,000,000 General Obligation School Refunding Bonds, not exceeding 5%, mature no later than March 1, 2031, refunding 2021 to 2030 maturities of General Obligation School Bonds, Series 2010 and 2022 to 2031 maturities of General Obligation School Bonds, Series 2011.

**19. L19-306 - Rapides Parish, City of Pineville**

Not exceeding \$2,738,000 Utilities Revenue Refunding Bonds, not exceeding 3%, mature no later than May 1, 2026, refunding Utilities Revenue Bonds, Series 2006.

**20. L19-297 - St. Tammany Parish, Waterworks District No. 2**

Not exceeding \$420,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds, not exceeding 3%, mature no later than March 1, 2028, refunding all or a portion of General Obligation Bonds, Series 2008.

**21. L19-300 - St. Tammany Parish School Board, Parishwide School District No. 12**

Not exceeding \$6,000,000 General Obligation School Refunding Bonds, not exceeding 4%, mature no later than April 1, 2031, refunding all or a portion of General Obligation School Bonds, Series 2011A.

**22. L19-299 - Tangipahoa Parish Council**

Not exceeding \$7,000,000 Revenue and Refunding Bonds, in one or more series, not exceeding 5%, not exceeding 30 years, (1) approximately \$2,300,000 Refunding Bonds, refunding all or a portion of Revenue Bonds, Series 2013, (2) approximately \$4,700,000 Revenue Bonds, expansion and improvements including but not limited to the addition of a new cell to the Parish landfill, (3) funding a debt service reserve fund, if necessary and (4) paying the premium associated with a debt service reserve fund surety, if necessary.

**23. L19-301 - Terrebonne Parish, Hospital Service District No. 1 (Terrebonne General Medical Center Project)**

Not exceeding \$15,000,000 Hospital Revenue Refunding Bonds, taxable or tax-exempt, not exceeding 6%, mature no later than April 1, 2028, (1) refunding Hospital Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2010 and (2) funding a deposit to a reserve fund.

Approval of a Facilities Lease between the Board of Supervisors of Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College and Pilots Pointe, LLC providing for the lease of a student housing facility currently known as University Court Apartments located on the campus of LSU-Shreveport.




